

Cooperation Agreement between

Delft University of Technology (LEAD PARTNER) and HUNRE

Concerning implementation of the project MK 27

"Inclusive development paths for healthy Red River landscapes based on ecosystem services"

Whereas

- IWMI, on behalf of WLE, has received funds from the CGIAR fund.
- IWMI has awarded a grant within the program on Water Land and Ecosystems (WLE) to the Delft University of Technology with contract number MK27 and title "Inclusive development paths for healthy red River landscapes based on ecosystem services" hereinafter referred to as MK27).
- The Delft University of Technology, hereinafter referred to as LEAD PARTNER has decided
 to sign an agreement with HUNRE hereinafter referred to as PARTNER to carry out part of
 the Research Project which is of mutual interest and benefit to the parties, as described in
 approved project proposal (annex 1) and in accordance with the attached project
 agreement (annex 2) between Lead partner and WLE (IWMI).

Now therefore, Lead Partner and Partner agree as follows:

Article 1. Subject of the agreement

- 1. Partner will be partner in the project and will provide its part of the services, as described in the approved project proposal as attached as annex 1 to this agreement and as further detailed under annex 2 of this agreement. Partner is responsible to TU Delft for the complete and timely execution of its portion of the project.
- The activities will be implemented in accordance with the articles in this agreement and in accordance with the project agreement between the funding agency, IWMI (on behalf of WLE-CGIAR), and TU Delft, with reference 4500025310, dated 15 December 2014, and attached to this agreement as annex 2.

Article 2 Services and planning

1. Within the framework of the project, partner will be responsible for the following tasks, with corresponding time scheduling and maximum budget :


- 2. The results of the project, i.e. reports, manuals, case studies, models, data and training materials, belong to the consortium and will only be used for the benefit of the project.
- 3. The planning of the provision of the project services by partner will be coordinated with the TU Project Manager, who is responsible for the overall planning and content of the project.
- 4. All expenditures on the project will have to be authorized, prior to these costs being made, by the TU project manager. In the case of travel of the HUNRE project team, she will approve terms of reference, itineraries, costs of tickets and per diems, prior to the travel.
- 5. TU Delft is responsible for the submission of project reports to WLE (progress reports, final report). Upon request, HUNRE will timely provide all relevant information for the preparation of these reports. Copies of the reports submitted to WLE will be sent to HUNRE.

Article 3 Price and payments

- 1. TU Delft will reimburse costs of HUNRE after approval in advance by the TU Project Manager. The reimbursement of costs will be transferred from TU Delft directly to VINWATER, who will directly transfer to PARTNER without any administration fee.
- Based on the approved project budget, HUNRE shall declare costs to the TU project
 manager on a half-yearly basis, with periods from January 1 to June 30 and July 1 to
 December 31. The cost statements will reflect real costs made and will be accompanied by
 supporting documents such as original billings, including hotel bills and ticket jackets, and
 time sheets for staff costs.

Article 4 General conditions

- This cooperation agreement is subject to the grant agreement between the funding agency, IWMI (on behalf of WLE-CGIAR), and TU Delft, with reference 4500025310. Should this overall grant expire, this agreement will also end and cease to be valid. Effort and costs already incurred by HUNRE shall be remunerated until expiry of the grant agreement. The services must end before end 2016.
- 2. This agreement shall enter into force on the date of signature by HUNRE.
